



Mock Disaster Exercise Sunday 1:30 – 4:30

2009...daily we are impacted by the every changing volatile economic challenges facing our nation. What happens when disaster strikes are you prepared to respond? H1N1 has been a widespread wake up call to evaluate plans, response strategies and sound practices. On top of that...what if you learn at one of your locations an explosion has just occurred. Information is sketchy...what do you do first? How do you determine the impact of the explosion? Have there been any employees injured or killed? If so, how do you know where the injured have been taken too, where are the survivors? What was the cause? Do you have to worry about secondary explosions? This exercise will evaluate life safety issues; investigate employee accountability issues, recovery team response and short & long term impact to the business. Is your team ready to respond? This mock exercise will challenge participants to deal with life safety decisions, fiscal impact control, crisis media intervention, interfacing with Fire and Law Enforcement. As you learn more about the explosion you will be tasked to deal with media issues, stock fluctuation, public image, death of employees and family outreach issues.
